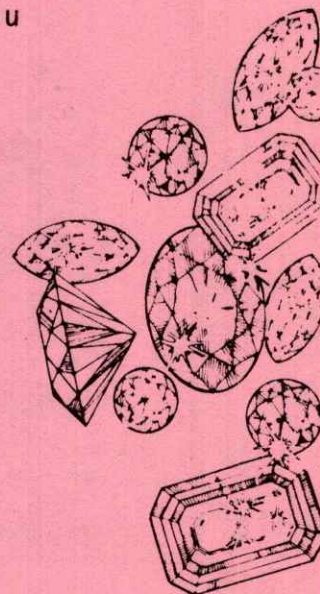
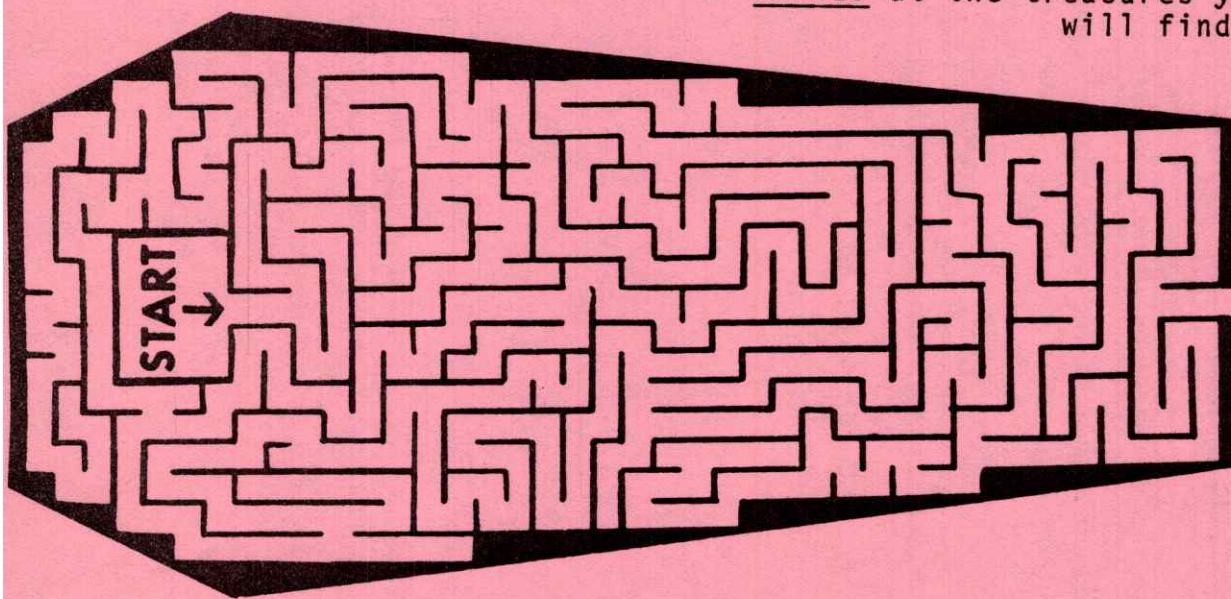

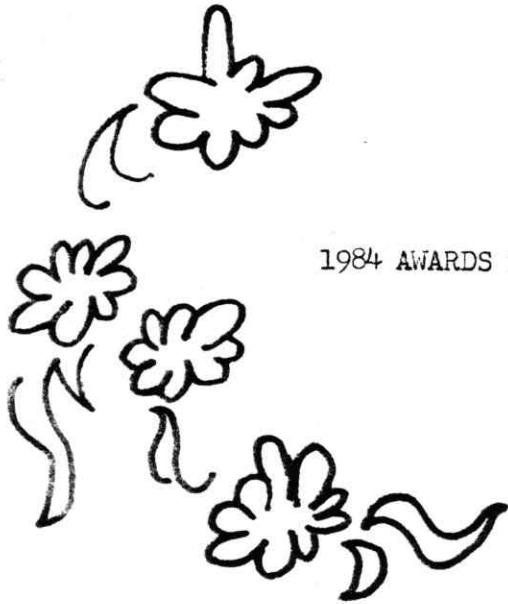

Mideast jewelry, rock races featured at gem, mineral show

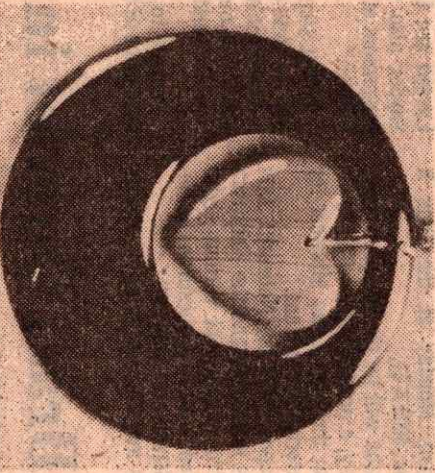
Middle Eastern jewelry will be one of the highlights at the 26th annual Gem and Mineral Show next weekend at the Nebraska State Fairgrounds' Agricultural Hall.

Hours for the show, sponsored by the Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club, are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. next Sunday.

The ethnic jewelry is the kind worn by men and women of nomadic tribes ranging from Morocco to Soviet Central Asia. The jewelry is made of nickel and nickel-silver and includes such stones as lapis lazuli and chalcodony. The jewelry has become scarce because of the deteriorating political climate in the Middle East, a gem club spokesman said.

Twelve dealers from Nebraska, Wisconsin, Colorado, Minnesota, Wyoming, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri and Oregon will be present. The dealers will stock cut and polished gems, finished jewelry, gem cutting equipment and other items. Lecture sessions include:

- **Playground paleontology** — by the Saratoga School science class, 11 a.m. Saturday.
- **Cutting and grading opals** — presented by Don Johannes, Naperville, Ill., 2 p.m. Saturday.
- **Fossil Collecting in Egypt** — presented by Lloyd Towner, University of Nebraska State Museum, 4 p.m. Saturday.

- **Ogallala Formation** — Janet Wright, a UNL graduate student in geology, will speak on the Ogallala Formation in western Nebraska, 2 p.m. next Sunday.

For the sports-minded, there will be rock races, which involves "racing" a rock down a sloping track. Proceeds from the 25 cent entry fee go to a scholarship fund.

Working demonstrators include:

- **Henry Hohnholt**, Kearney, agate frames and stained-glass frames.
- **Art Henry**, Omaha, rock paintings.
- **Martha Thorpe**, St. Joseph, Mo., rock novelties.
- **Hugh and Bev Carroll**, Fort Dodge, Iowa, gemstone trees and pictures.

- **Stan Shurtleff**, Humboldt, sphere making and unusual lapidary practices.
- **Connie McCartney**, Grand Island, scrimshaw.
- **Mary McCartney**, Grand Island, steam casting of precious metals.
- **Claude Dawson**, Dorra, Mo., sterling silver models of famous early American sailing ships.
- **Don Wicks**, Springfield, Ore., agates from the Pacific Northwest.

There will be more than 100 displays provided by the Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club and neighboring Nebraska clubs.

Tickets are \$1.50 for adults, \$1 for senior citizens and students with identification, 50 cents for children. Children under 6 admitted free with an adult.
