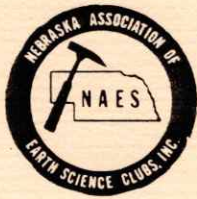

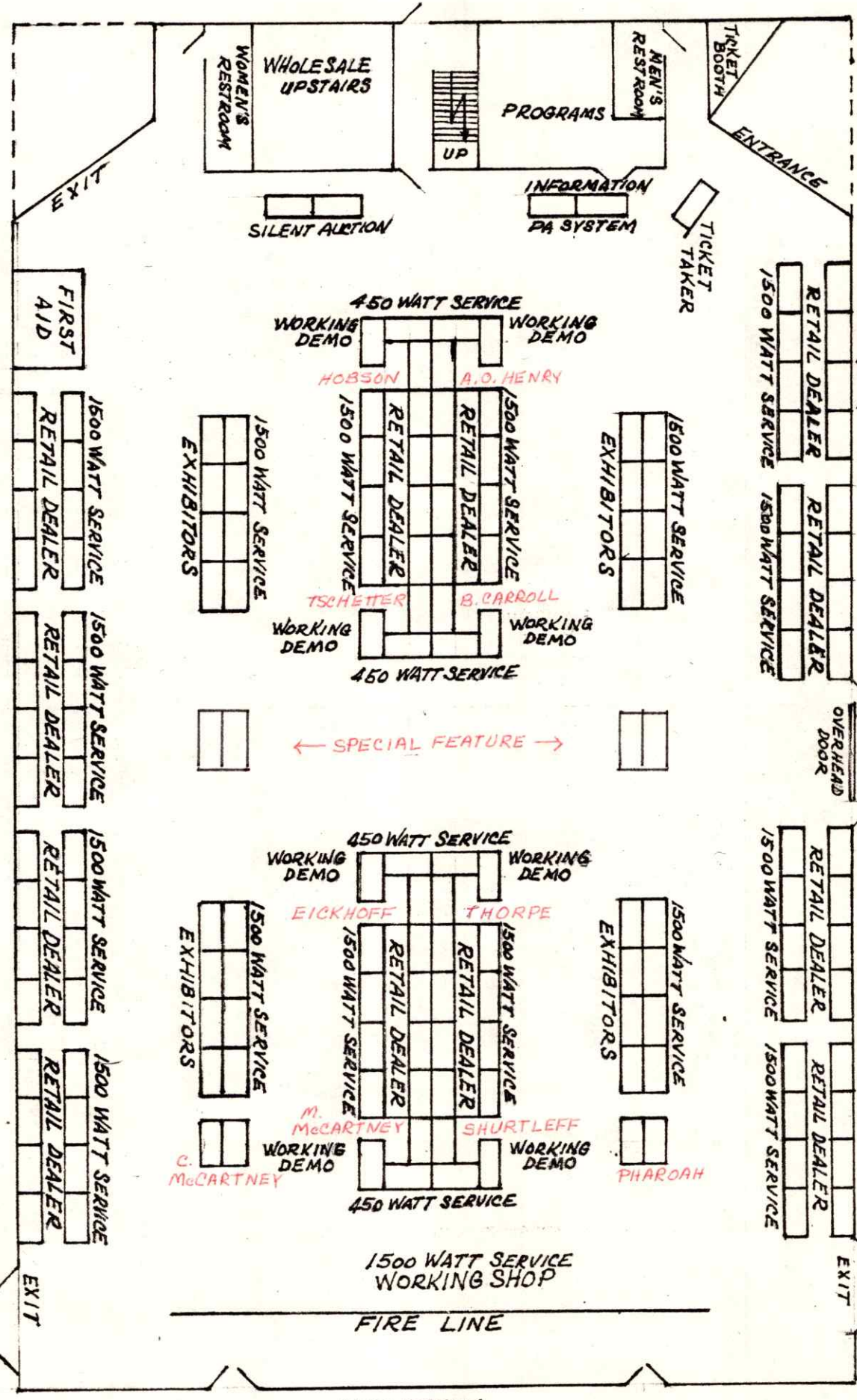
All exhibitors are asked to furnish a brief description of the exhibit.

Description of exhibit:

EXHIBITOR'S ADVISORY

To facilitate management of the 25th Gem and Mineral Show, each exhibitor is requested to comply with the following instructions and guidelines.

1. RIBBONS: Exhibitors may obtain their ribbons at the registration booth. Those exhibitors not getting their ribbons on set up day may obtain them the following morning. Each exhibitor is entitled to one exhibitor's ribbon. Each exhibitor's ribbon authorizes one free admission to the show.
2. SET UP: Each exhibitor is requested to have his display installed and in order at the opening of the show. Each exhibitor is to remove his exhibit immediately after the close of the show. Installation may be done on Friday, March 25, 1983, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 9:00 P.M., unless other arrangements have been made with the show committee.
3. SHOW HOURS: The show will open at 9:00 A.M. and close at 9:00 P.M. Saturday, March 26, and will open at 9:00 A.M. and close at 5:00 P.M. on Sunday, March 27.
4. REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS: No exhibitor may dismantle or remove his display before 5:00 P.M. March 27, 1983, without written consent of the show committee.
5. USE OF SPACE: Exhibitors may not assign or share any part of the space allocated to them without approval of the show committee.
6. RESTRICTIONS: The Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club reserves the right to restrict any exhibit which for any reason is objectionable, and also to prohibit any exhibit which in unanimous opinion of the show committee, may hinder the general character of the show. This includes persons, things, printed matter, political matter, sales material, or any other material which may detract from the general character and atmosphere of the show. Distribution of advertising matter in any part of the show is strictly forbidden without the written authorization of the show committee. In the event of such restriction or eviction, the Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club, its members, officers, or authorized agents will not be liable for any refund of exhibitor expenses.
7. SECURITY AND LIABILITY: The Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club will furnish around the clock security and will take all reasonable and expected precautions to protect the property and person of each exhibitor. However, it is mutually agreed that the Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club, its members, officers, or authorized agents shall not be liable to any exhibitor for any damage to or for the loss of or destruction of any exhibit in whole or in part. This includes the property of any exhibitor or injury to his person resulting from any cause. All claims for any such loss, damage, or injury is expressly waived by the exhibitor. Submission of this signed application for exhibitors space constitutes acceptance of all the rules and regulations as outlined above.
8. SPECIAL SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS: Those exhibits requiring special security arrangements, or exhibitors wishing to hire private security officers should contact either the show chairman or the floor chairman.

FOCUS

Fossils, jewelry, agates on display

Displays of agates, finished jewelry, fossils and more will draw rockhounds from the northern Great Plains to Lincoln on Saturday and next Sunday for the 25th annual Gem and Mineral Show sponsored by the Lincoln Gem and Mineral Club.

The show will be held in the Agricultural Hall at the Nebraska State Fairgrounds. Hours are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$1 for adults and 50 cents for children under 12.

The show will feature displays from members of Nebraska's 20 gem and mineral societies.

Most participating dealers also will present displays. San Juan Gems of Cortez, Colo., will furnish a display of eggs made from agatized dinosaur bone, and Dick's Rock Museum of Estes Park, Colo., will display del Norte Plume agate from Colorado. Neither have been shown before in the Lincoln area. Gem-Tec Diamond Tool Co. of Buena Park, Calif., will

display Australian Opal. Phil and Joni Andrist of Bandon, Ore., will show Laguna agate from Mexico.

Many exhibitors will feature Nebraska materials, and Roger Pabian of Lincoln will show specimens illustrated in his book, "Minerals and Gemstones of Nebraska." Pabian, a research geologist with the Conservation and Survey Division of the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, also will give an illustrated lecture on Nebraska gemstones at 3:30 p.m. Saturday.

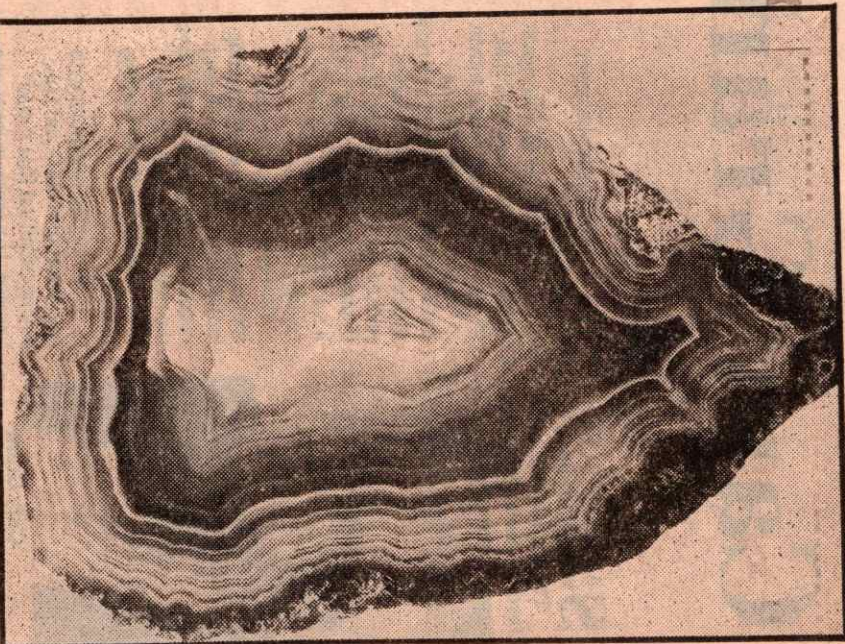
Professor Lloyd Tanner of the University of Nebraska State Museum will give an illustrated program at 1:30 p.m. Saturday and 1:30 p.m. Sunday on his recent fossil collecting expeditions to the Fayum area of Egypt.

Nine working demonstrators will show their skills. Among crafts to be demonstrated will be sphere and marble making; scrimshaw, making fine detailed etchings on ivory; making gemstone pictures, rock novelties and paintings on rocks; silversmithing; and gem cutting.

Twelve retail dealers from Oregon, Minnesota, Colorado, Illinois, Kansas and Nebraska will offer gem and lapidary supplies, such as rough and finished stones, finished jewelry, agates, jade, mineral specimens, findings, mountings, metals and shop equipment.

A contest featuring "Nebraska's Best Specimens" will be open to members of any Nebraska gem and mineral club, and each contestant may enter as many as three stones, fossils, minerals or other gem-related items. Visitors can vote Saturday for "Nebraska's Finest." The winner will be announced at an awards breakfast 8 a.m. Sunday morning.

Lancaster County Civil Defense will discuss tornado preparedness at 10 a.m. Saturday and the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission will have a presentation on Nebraska parks at 11 a.m. Saturday.
