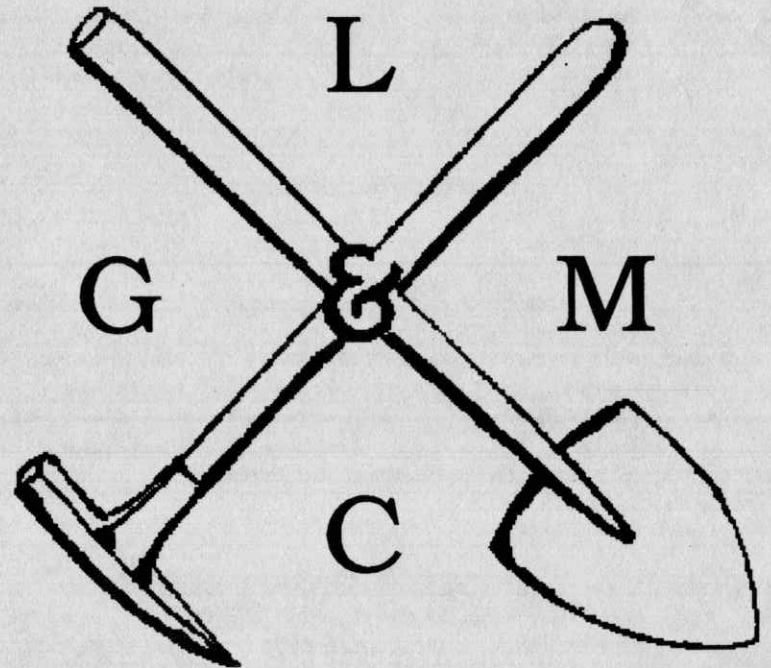


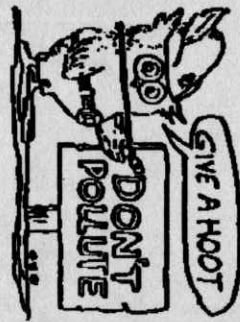

GOLD MINING-Emily Rieur

If you like mining, Idaho Springs, Colorado has a working mine that you can tour! The Phoenix Mine on ~~Trail~~ Creek Road is a working mine where you can actually use a pick and shovel. Al Mosch, owner of the mine greeted us and told the history of the mine. An outcrop of ore caught a prospector's eye in 1871. The mine has always been called the Phoenix and has been sold three different times for \$5000. Mr. Mosch, the current owner, bought it almost one hundred years after the first purchaser. Hard hats must be worn in the mine. After we walked deep into the drift, veins of ore could be easily viewed. Miners use different tools to extract the minerals. Antique tools to modern drills are on display. My father and I were allowed to climb down a shaft on a ladder and try mining the old fashioned way, chiseling. I held a special miner's light, keeping it on the vein that really looked like pyrite to me. (Mr. Mosch showed us how the crystals of fool's gold were more cubed.) We mined a handful of ore in about 20 minutes using a hammer and chisel. There was dust everywhere. I could see how miners got pneumonoultramicroscopic silicovolcanoconiosis (miner's lung disease)! Good thing I had a hard hat on to protect me as I hit my head several times on low support beams. At the end of our tour, Mr. Mosch turned off all the lights in the mine so that we could see what it's like to mine with only a single light. We were glad when the lights were turned on again 20 seconds later! Mr. Mosch insisted we keep the gold ore we mined. Had it been summer, we could have panned for gold in the stream in front of the mine portal. In December, the water is too cold, so we made up for that by swimming in the hot water of Indian Springs resort. Utes and then miners used these same springs on the banks of Soda Creek more than a hundred years ago.

This month I would like to talk about another type of RESPONSIBILITY. That of being good stewards of this, our hobby.

I was very upset, and very concerned when I heard from several sources, and also read in a recent exchange bulletin, that some people field tripping in one of our Ohio quarries, used a powered masonry saw to extract specimens. This was done without the proper authority. I think most of you know that the use of HAND TOOLS is all that is allowed. I am not sure if the proper authorities of the quarry were aware of these actions. Whether or not they were, this will cause a problem in the future. Remember, use only HAND TOOLS, wear a hard hat, sturdy shoes, and stay at least 12 feet away from the walls. If the word gets around about an incident like this, it could close all the quarries in the state. On the inside of the front cover of the MWF Directory you will find the "AFMS CODE OF ETHICS". PLEASE READ IT, and adhere to what it says, so we can have good collecting in the future. It is a privilege to be allowed to collect in quarries anywhere. Good collecting sites are hard to come by, let's not lose them!

WHAT HAPPENED IN DENVER? GOOD NEWS...there are now 7 federations. The new federation is the SOUTHEAST FEDERATION, and covers North and South Carolina, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, Alabama, Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia and Louisiana. The president Larry Gilbert was seated as AFMS Regional Vice President. Carter Coe, SFMS 1st VP, and Leo Morris, editor were seated as AFMS directors. This 7th federation falls into rotation for shows and conventions in 1999, after the next MWF national show in 1998. The 25c dues increase was accepted (more below), and two new committees were formed. One whose responsibility will be publications and supplies, and the other to investigate a manner to have individuals as associates in the AFMS.

At the fall meeting in Sioux City, Iowa on October 2, we had a good group...including 6 State Directors!!! One of the items on the agenda, was the approval of a bid from Michigan Mineralogical Society in Detroit, to host the 1995 Show and Convention in October of that year. Reports were given, and new chairman were announced...these were listed in your November newsletter.

The Spring meeting will be held in Columbus, Ohio on April 9, 1994 in conjunction with the spring show of the Columbus Rock and Mineral Society. Two of the items that will be on the agenda for this meeting will be the discussion of another 25c raise for the AFMS dues. At the AFMS meeting in Denver in September, they accepted the proposed 25c raise in dues offered by the federations. This will take effect on January 1, 1995. At the National show in Houston next June, they are planning on asking for an additional 25c increase. We will need direction as to how to vote on this issue, so please be thinking about this item. Some clubs and individuals are under the misconception that the MWF is raising their dues...THEY ARE NOT.

Also, be prepared to talk about "HOW TO GET YOUTH INVOLVED" in this great hobby. The 'youth' will be one of the things that is going to be a primary topic during my tenure as president. You will be hearing more on this topic in future newsletters. Those of you who have an established program for 'youth', please send that information on to me, and I will see that it gets to the proper place.

Look for a "PROPOSAL" in futures issues. In the meantime, I am looking forward to an exciting year as your President.
