## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings!

So far in my president's messages, I have talked about four aspects of sharing: going out into the community, through our shows, through bulletins, and by serving on Federation committees. This month I finally come to the area where most messages about sharing start, whether they are sermons in church or letters from the United Way or charities. That area, of course, is money.



There are three funds supported by clubs that are above and beyond the required dues. The oldest one, well-known to almost all members of our clubs, is the American Federation Scholarship Foundation. The principal of this fund is invested, and only the interest is used for the scholarships that are given. Each Federation chooses an individual to honor; that person chooses a university or college, and then, working with the school, chooses two students who receive the scholarships. Students must already have a bachelor's degree and be doing graduate work in some aspect of the earth sciences. By now, the principal of the fund is large enough so that each year 14 scholarships can be given, two in each Federation, each for two years at \$2,000 a year, for a total of \$4,000 per student. If you look in the pink pages at the back of the Directory, you will see the list of individuals honored and students aided. If your club wants to share its wealth for scholarships, make checks out to AFMS Scholarship Fund, and send them to Luella DeVoe, Midwest Federation Scholarship Chairman, Rt. #1, Box 218, Tomah, WI 54660.

The second fund supported by the generosity of clubs and individuals is the Midwest Federation Endowment Fund. Because we have one of the lower dues amounts asked of each club for its members, we have not built up a large cash reserve. The income from the invested principal of the Endowment Fund serves to buy items too large for our budget, such as the computers purchased for the Federation secretary and the bulletin editor. It also can be used, if so voted by the Executive Committee, to supplement the dues to balance the Federation budget. So far, though such permission has

been given, it has not been needed. To contribute to this fund, make checks out to Midwest Federation Endowment Fund, and send them to William Cook, Midwest Federation Endowment Fund Treasurer, 684 Quilliams Rd., Cleveland Hts., OH 44121-1955.

The third fund I mentioned is the American Federation Endowment Fund, which works similarly to our regional federation endowment. A small amount of its earnings are in this year's AFMS budget, though again they probably will not need to be used. To support this fund, make checks to AFMS Endowment Fund and send to Toby Cozens, AFMS Treasurer, 4401 S.W. Hill St., Seattle, WA 96116-1924.

New memberships must be approved by the Board, after the applicant attends at least one meeting of the club and pays the above dues plus a \$5.00 registration fee.



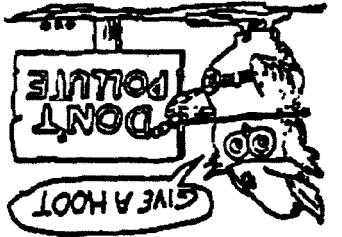

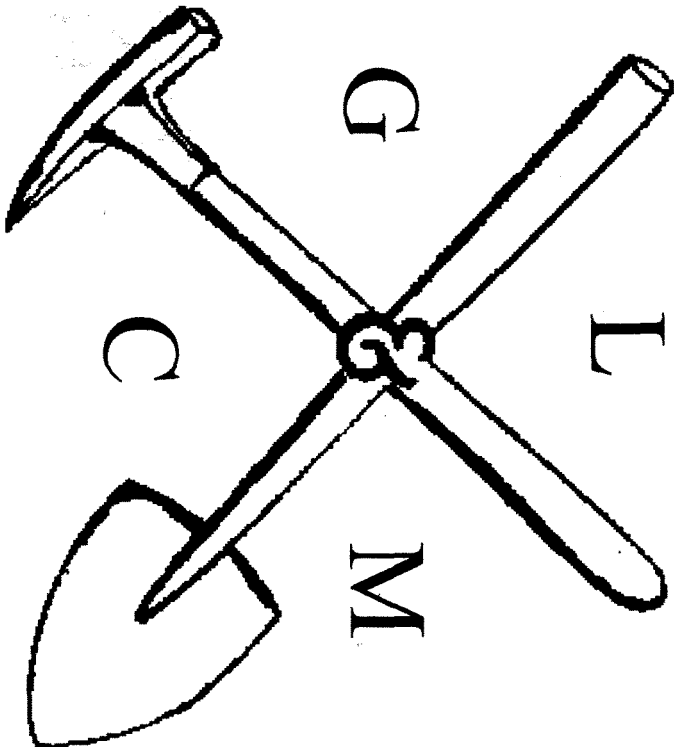
