OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the December meeting were published in the Pick & Shovel. Ed Dvorak moved to accept the minutes as printed, second by Robert Cropp. Motion carried. The Treasurer's report was read by Treasurer Lyman. Terry Anderson moved to accept the report as read, second by Jayne Beer. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

With the unexpected death of Roger Pabian, the SCC Lapidary Class was without an instructor. Robert Cropp volunteered to teach the class and was subsequently appointed by the Board of Directors. Al Stewart was nominated and elected as second in command, assisting as needed and teaching when Robert is not available. This news was greeted with eager applause.

Geology Day is scheduled for February 13, 2011 at the Chet Ager Nature Center at Pioneers Park.

The annual Grinding Party is planned for July 10, 2011 at the Chet Ager Nature Center at Pioneers Park.

The annual Science Fair sponsored by Novartis-Pfizer and Lincoln Public Schools is to be held at the Lancaster Event Center this year, on Tuesday, March 29 from 4:00 – 8:00 p.m. More information will be available by the next meeting. Anyone interested in participating can talk to First Vice-President Al Stewart.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

LGMC Board Meeting, January 5, 2011, Gere Library

The January meeting was called to order by President Richard Peterson. Board members present were Richard Peterson (“Pete”), Al Stewart, Ed Dvorak, Vera Lyman, Sharon Marburger, Robert Cropp (“Rowdy”), Ed Ridge, and Charles Wooldridge (“Wooly”). Jim Marburger was excused due to recovering from surgery. Judy Cropp attended as a visitor. Nancy Holmgren of Southeast Community College attended a portion of the meeting to discuss the open teaching position for the Lapidary Class.

The unexpected death of Roger Pabian left the Lapidary Class with no teacher. Ms. Holmgren was wondering how the club would like to proceed. After discussing the available options, and upon Rowdy volunteering to take up where Roger left off, Wooly moved to approve Rowdy as teacher of the Lapidary Class, to carry on Roger’s legacy; second by Ed Dvorak. Motion carried. Sharon Marburger moved to name Al Stewart as substitute teacher in the event Rowdy couldn’t make a class, second by Ed Dvorak. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the December meeting were distributed. Wooly moved to accept the minutes, second by Ed Dvorak. Motion carried. The Treasurer’s report was distributed. Sharon Marburger moved to accept the report, second by Ed Ridge. Motion carried.

The Rock Swap will be on January 22, 2011. Pete asked that everyone help with advertising, and Sharon said she would arrange it as in the past.

The show plans appear to be on track. Ed Dvorak reported that one more dealer is needed due to a cancellation.

The website has completed its move to a new web host. The name remains the same. Jim Atkins was able to successfully upload the December Pick & Shovel. Billing has not yet been submitted.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Board requested Show Chairman Ed Dvorak to consider dedicating the 2011 Show to Roger Pabian. Ed graciously agreed. There was some discussion of possibly holding an off site memorial supper on Saturday night of the Show. A reminder that the Sunday Dealers’ Breakfast could be in memory of Roger, and anyone wishing to attend could so do. The discussion was tabled pending further consideration.

The \$25 memorial for Roger Pabian will be used to pay for a portion of the Bethany Park Shelter rent for the evening of April 2, when a memorial supper will be held. Another discussion was had concerning possibly creating an award in Roger’s name. One idea is to rename the Lapidary Class fund as the Roger Pabian Lapidary Fund, or something similar. No action was taken at this time.

Wooly would like to see the Club have a Facebook account. The subject will be presented to the rank and file to see if a responsible person would like to volunteer.

Vera Lyman has scheduled the usual meeting locations for the following dates: Board meetings – February 2, March 2, March 30 (April), May 4, August 31 (September), October 5, November 2, and November 30 (December). General meetings – January 22, February 17, March 17, April 21, May 19, September 15, October 20, November 17, and December 4. Geology Day will be February 13 and the Grinding Party will be July 10. Provided there is a quorum, a meeting with a picnic will be held on July 10 in the park, following the Grinding Party. June and August meetings will be held at the location of those months’ Rock Parties.

The meeting adjourned at 7:47 p.m. on a motion by Robert Cropp, second by Al Stewart. Motion carried.

“TOTALLY AWESOME” COOKIES!

Vera Lyman made some wonderful oatmeal lace cookies for the Mid-Winter Swap. Everyone who ate them commented that they were “totally awesome” (and they were!). At the request of many people, Vera has graciously provided the recipe to be published here.

2/3 cup butter
 2 cups quick oatmeal
 1 cup granulated sugar
 2/3 cup all-purpose flour
 1/4 cup dark corn syrup
 1/4 cup milk
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1-3/4 cups (11.5 oz. pkg.) Nestle Toll House Milk Chocolate Morsels

Preheat oven to 375° F. Line baking sheets with foil.
 Melt butter in medium saucepan; remove from heat.

Stir in oats, sugar, flour, corn syrup, milk, vanilla extract, and salt; mix well.

Drop by level teaspoon, about 3 inches apart, onto prepared baking sheets. Flatten with moist fingers.

Bake for 6-8 minutes or until golden brown. **Cool completely** on baking sheets. Peel foil from cookies.

Microwave chocolate morsels on medium-high (70% power) for one minute. **STIR**. If necessary, microwave at additional 10 second intervals, stirring just until morsels are melted. Spread a thin layer of melted chocolate onto flat side of half the cookies. Top with remaining cookies.

Makes about 3-1/2 dozen sandwich cookies. ☺

All new memberships must be accompanied by a written application. Prospective members must gain Board approval and attend one regular meeting before being approved for membership.

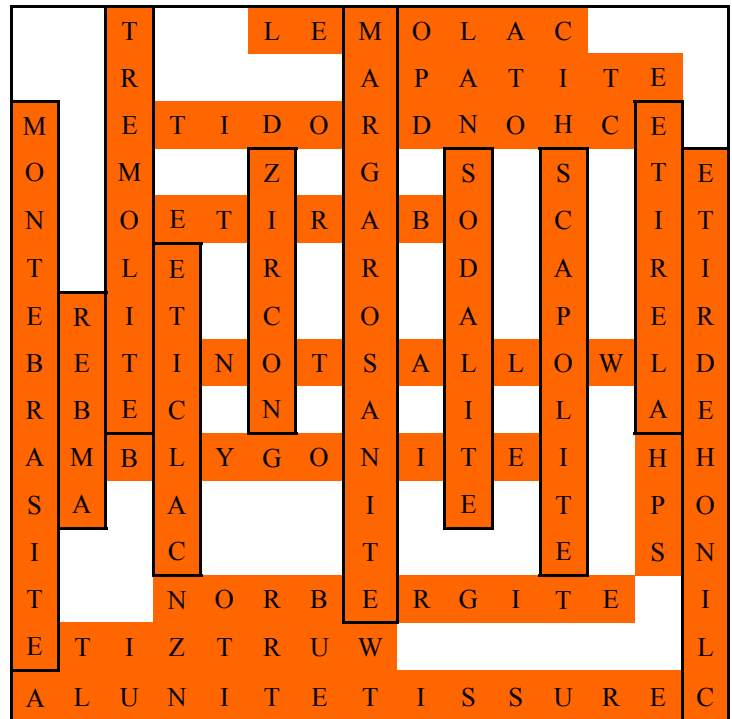
