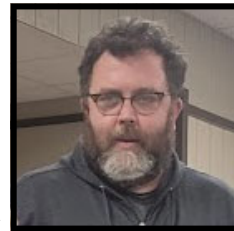

The minutes of the April meeting were distributed. Jim moved to accept the minutes, second by Jayne. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Vera provided updated numbers of the Show, indicating a couple of bills are still outstanding. Even so, a nice profit to allow updating some equipment. Sharon moved to accept the report, second by Jim. Motion carried.

Old Business:

Sharon requested that we change the Silent Auction to a "Club Rock Pile". Two of our venues are not conducive to silent auctions; purchases made immediately would work better. The Board was in favor of the change. Brett added that we could still have Silent Auctions at the meetings.

Brett J. and Clyde Ogg will continue to look for the best projector for our club. At this time, Brett has located two that could work. One is at \$500 the other is around \$700.

Brett has also looked for new UV lights for the club trailer. He has found three companies: Ingenious Designs, which has no large lights, but does have flashlights; Way Too Cool has some 190 watt dual 2 low wave 190 with a cost around \$1,575 and \$2675, respectively; and UV Systems has more to choose from. Jim had looked at UV lamps 262 Range Germicidal. It was mentioned that these lights are dangerous and need caution when working with them. The trailer needs four bulbs each of 45-50 watts long wave and short wave. Both Jim and Brett want to look into the bulbs a little more before we buy.

In Wooly's absence, Sharon mentioned the club hats that he would like to purchase for members. Brett asked about T-shirts and Jayne will check what she has left, before we purchase more. Badges were discussed. Vera said the previous badge purchases had come from Rixstines. Brett asked if we should have a contest for a new badge design. The Board thought to have the badges 3 inches round in Blue and Gold with our club logo on them. Sharon will look at Baudville to see what they have and Vera will look at Rixstines again for badges.

Brett asked about name tags and Vera said we should have each member write their name on paper, as they want it on the name tags.

Brett stated the Messenger field trip went very well. Sharon stated Karen will now call UNL to take the rest of the items from the building. Sharon also informed the Board that she was told Karen Messinger fell and broke her hip. (It turns out this information was incorrect. Karen is just recovering from the stroke she had late last year.) Charles Messenger passed away a few days before our field trip.

Brett would like to have a memorial case, at our next show, honoring Charles Messenger. This would include a few items we collected from his building.
